

- talk/associate with others
- join an activity or group

Bullying

- Word "bully" is overused and misused
- Verbal intimidation/peer pressure
- Physical injury
- Verbal or physical domination of another
- Needs to be repeated (1 time = meanness)



Rumoring

- Using gossip to spread lies or secrets
- Purpose is to humiliate the person
- Demean his or her social reputation
- Attention-seeking by gossiper
- Ask "Why are you telling me this?"

Within the past week, all sixth grade students participated in a lesson with a school counselor on social cruelty. Unfortunately, adolescence can be a time where "meanness" can increase. After discussing different types of social cruelty (teasing, excluding, bullying, rumoring, ganging up), it was impressed upon our students to THINK before speaking/acting. THINK is an acronym standing for... is it True, Helpful, Inspirational, Necessary, Kind!
