

NOVA SCOTIA, CANADA

Plus Prince Edward Island & New Brunswick 12 Days - 11 Nights

The sample itinerary described below is approximately like the one your group will be following during your stay with WHITE STAR TOURS. However, the exact times, days, and destinations may vary for your group.

- Day 1 -Depart from Wisconsin and travel to your first overnight stop for lodging (pack an overnight bag); dinner is on your own this evening.
- Day 2- Continental breakfast, then check out and continue traveling towards Canada. Arrive at your second overnight to check into your hotel (pack an overnight bag) and prepare for dinner on your own in the area.
- Day 3 Continental breakfast, then check out and travel to Bangor, ME where lodging has been arranged for you this evening. **Dinner** has been arranged for you this evening.
- Day 4 Your day begins with breakfast after which you will check out and travel to impressive **Acadia National Park on Mount Desert Island for a guided tour**. Nearly 50,000 acres of coastline and woods make up this park that is laced with more than 45 miles of carriage trails built by John. D. Rockefeller, Jr. **Cadillac Mountain** is the highest mountain on the eastern seaboard and is the crown jewel of Acadia. Later, you will arrive in the seaside village of **Bar Harbor** for lunch on your own. Afterwards, you will board the afternoon **High Speed Ferry** for the 3 1/2- hour crossing to Yarmouth, Nova Scotia. Dinner is on your own on board the ferry. Arrive in Yarmouth to check into your hotel for a restful evening.
- Day 5 Start your day with breakfast at the hotel, then depart on a tour along the southern shore to **Old Town Lunenburg**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, where 70 of the original colonial buildings from the 18th and 19th centuries continue to greet visitors with their colorful facades. Enjoy a **walking tour of Old Town Lunenburg's distinctive waterfront** with its colorful buildings; listen for salty tales of seafaring and rumrunning; discover a charming town filled with amazing restaurants, distilleries, breweries, artisans and unique shops. You will have time for lunch on your own before departing for picturesque **Peggy's Cove** to see the famous lighthouse that sits high upon the wave-worn granite of the coast in this quaint fishing village. The tiny harbor below is a masterpiece of seasoned fish sheds and colorful fishing boats ... one of the most photographed places in Canada. After your visit, check into your hotel in Halifax for a two-night stay. **Dinner** is included this evening.
- Day 6 Enjoy a breakfast, then spend the day **touring in Halifax**. Your tour begins with a visit to the **Maritime Museum of the Atlantic** which tells the story of the Great Explosion in Halifax Harbor in 1917 as well as the history of the sinking of the Titanic and the story of how the victims that washed up along Nova Scotia's shoreline were laid to rest. The Museum sits right on Halifax Harbor, which is the 2nd largest natural harbor in the world. This afternoon, you will enjoy a **Harbor Cruise** after which your city tour continues to **Fairview Lawn Cemetery**, where the victims of the Titanic disaster have been buried. Your day will end with a delicious **dinner** at another popular restaurant in the area.
- Day 7 After breakfast, check out and travel to the neighboring province of New Brunswick before crossing the incredible Confederation Bridge to Prince Edward Island. Enjoy a City Tour of Charlottetown. Continue to your hotel to check in for a two-night stay. This evening you will depart for dinner and a show at the **Confederation Center for the Arts** which celebrates the origins and evolution of Canada through a rich variety of heritage and arts. It is also home to the **Charlottetown Festival Theater** which has been producing **Anne of Green Gables the Musical** every summer since 1965.
- Day 8 After breakfast, meet your guide for a **full day of touring of Prince Edward Island** which begins with the scenic village of New Glasgow where you will visit the **Prince Edward Island Preserve Company** for a chance to sample some of the wonderful products. Afterwards, continue to the National Historic Site of **Anne of Green Gables**, which is known for the world-famous novel written by island native Lucy Maud Montgomery. Step back in time as you visit the carefully maintained home, in the 1800s style, of fictional character *Anne of Green Gables*. Later, you will enjoy a traditional, Prince Edward-style **lobster dinner**. Return to your hotel for a relaxing evening.

CONFIRMATION: Due to time and expense, we do not send confirmations when classes are going as scheduled. Assume your registration is confirmed and the class will meet as scheduled if you have submitted your registration from and fees. You will only be notified if a class is filled or canceled.

PRE-REGISTRATION: Pre-registration is of MOST importance. Lack of registrations will cause the class to be canceled one week prior to the beginning.

CANCELLATIONS: No class will be conducted without sufficient registrations. When maximum capacity has been reached for any class, registration for the class will be closed.

WEATHER CANCELLATIONS: If school is canceled due to bad weather, all buildings will be closed that same evening. If school is in session, generally evening programs will run.

REFUND POLICY: If, after pre-registering, it is necessary for you to cancel, notify the PACE office no less than one week before the beginning of the class, your fee, minus a \$5.00 cancellation fee, will be refunded. Simply not attending the class or camp you registered for does not qualify you for a refund.

NON-SUFFICIENT-FUND CHECK POLICY: A fee of \$35 will be added to the amount of the NSF check, and full reimbursement must be paid in cash, to the PACE Office, prior to attending the selection.
